

## Apple advice and hints 2

### Saving money

When items are recommended online, there will probably be commission accruing to whoever (website or individual) who makes the recommendation.

To benefit from that yourself, go into TopCashBack, and go to the website for the item you want. When you order something that way you buy the item and get a percentage (varying from 1% upwards) cash back. For eg Broadband this could be £20-£100.

### Passwords

Autofill will suggest a password for a website. It will be saved on iCloud, using your Apple ID on 'keychain'. Using Settings, this can then be accessed from different devices. (Note: Safari works differently from Chrome)

This is in the process of being changed so that eventually passwords will be replaced by 'passkey', which uses face or touch recognition for authentication; once you have gone into a website it will recognise you this way next time you use it.

In the meantime, an alternative shortcut is to bookmark the page of the website you are interested in.

### Tab Groups

Instead of having to open and close different windows when working on something, eg booking a holiday or choosing something to buy, create Tab Groups that you can go back to.

Tap on ... and create a name for the group. You can then save that group of tabs (windows) and go back to it whenever you want, and from different devices.

A bookmark only saves one website, whereas you might want to access several different ones, eg rail times, accommodation, activity.

Menu, touch and hold window to Copy/Add/Move/ Arrange or Close.

The first window is 'private' (particular to the device); all the rest are generated by the user.
